PONDERINGS OF THE PASTOR

"Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love."
--Joel 2:13b – 15

Dear friend in Christ,

It's hard to believe that we are rapidly moving toward the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is February 14th this year, a shared date with Valentine's Day. What an amazing reminder that no one loves you more than God!

Our Lenten mid-week worship theme this year is 24 Hours that Changed the World, based on the book by Adam Hamilton. Our journey will take us through the last hours of Jesus' life: the Garden of Gethsemane, his condemnation by the righteous, his torture and humiliation, and ultimately his crucifixion.

So just what is "Lent?" "In Wester Christianity, Ash Wednesday marks the first day, or the start of the seasons of Lent, which begins 40 days prior to Easter. (Sundays are not included in the count.) Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ – his suffering an his sacrifice, his life, death, burial, and resurrection." www.christianity.about.com

During the season of Lent our Sunday worship patterns change a bit. We sing the Kyrie, "Lord have mercy on us," to remind us that we come to God on our humble knees asking for forgiveness and mercy. We eliminate the Hymn of Praise. We take away the "Alleluias" in our hymnody and add them back into worship on Easter Sunday when we rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Worship has a somber tone to help us reflect on who we are as Christians and disciples of Jesus in light of Christ's death on the

cross for you and for me. The scripture verse above from the Old Testament book of Joel is one of the appointed verses for our worship on Ash Wednesday. The prophet Joel reminds us of our need to turn away from all the ways that lead us to death in our lives – all our bad choices - and instead turn to God – our merciful, loving God – who wants us to live life fully and abundantly. So, we welcome the season of Lent with this challenge and promise from the prophet Joel: "Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love."



A big THANK YOU to everyone who helped with our ELCA Good Gifts Challenge for our Confirmation youth!

As we studied local and global hunger and poverty, Pastor Mary Ann introduced the Confirmation class to the ELCA Good Gifts Catalog during the holiday season. Initially it was just the Confirmation youth who had the challenge to bring in a family offering

that would be used to purchase items from the catalog (our Confirmation youth are from Luck Lutheran, First in Cushing, and North Valley). That initial offering was \$470. Wow! They prayerfully and carefully discerned what to buy with those dollars and decided that a Fish Farm and Community Garden with Honey Bees, tools, and instructional materials was the way to go. Total cost: \$470. But then the concern mounted: "We need water. And water filters are \$30. How can we do this?" They decided they would each kick in \$2 the following week. And that's when it happened. Not only did the kids kick in more money the following week, other parishioners from each of the congregations started adding to the total, including free will offerings at the end of worship at each church. The result? \$1,300 was given in total for the kids and their Good Gifts Project. So with that money, and after more careful discernment, this is what they chose in addition to what they had already decided: A herd of goats (\$300), 10 Water Filters (\$300), a portion of an Irrigation Project (\$100), 2 piglets (\$60), Drought Resistant Seeds and Gardening Tools (\$50), School Supplies for a Child (\$10), and a Mosquito Net (\$10). Thank you, everyone, for teaching our youth the importance of being generous for the sake of God's mission. We have been blessed to be a blessing!


