ELW #302 "As With Gladness Men of Old" verses 1 & 4

"As with gladness men of old did the guiding star behold;
As with joy they hailed its light, leading onward, beaming bright;
So most gracious Lord, may we evermore be led by thee.

Holy Jesus, every day keep us in the narrow way; And when earthly things are past, bring our ransomed souls at last Where they need no star to guide, where no clouds thy glory hide."



Dear friends in Christ.

There are times when God shows up at unexpected times and in unexpected places. And, with God's help, adversities can turn into blessings. That's what happened for William Chatterton Dix, the writer of this hymn. He was sick in bed, and for a diversion, he read his daily devotional. The appointed scripture for the day was Matthew 2:1 – 12, the story of the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus. The result of his daily devotional reading on that day is this hymn: "As with Gladness Men of Old." He wrote it on January 6, 1859 – the Day of Epiphany - while he was sick in bed with much prayerful time for reflection. How ironic, that on the Day of Epiphany, he had a huge epiphany himself as he penned the beautiful words to this hymn.

"Epiphany" means "manifestation," or "ah-ha" moments, as I oftentimes say. This season is filled with images of light that break through the darkness. The biblical Epiphany points to the true Light – Jesus Christ – the one who is the way, the truth, and the life – the One in whom no darkness can ever overcome.

In this gospel story, it was the wise men from Chaldea – current day Iran – who weren't even Jewish – who found the baby Jesus by following a star at its rising for over 900 miles. After a tense encounter with the tyrannical King Herod, the wise men left Bethlehem by another route. They carried the message of the Messiah back to people in other regions or the world far beyond the walls of Jerusalem. God chose these unlikely foreigners to be the delivery agents of the good news of Jesus Christ to people who did not know anything about him.

This is what the church season of Epiphany is all about: Discovering glimpses of truth regarding what God is up to in our lives; comprehending the "ah-ha" moments that Jesus Christ is the Savior of the whole world. Jesus, this small boy-child of Mary, is the way, the truth, and the life for all people. And the wise men were God's chosen players in bringing this message of hope and promise far and wide beyond Jerusalem and the Jewish people. And in this divine journey, the wise men trusted they were being led in the right direction by a powerful force that was beyond what they could ever imagine or comprehend.

In this season of "ah-ha" moments, where is God leading you that may surprise you? Where are some places God shows up/has shown up in your life that you least expect?

- I. Meeting was called to order by President Donna J.
- II. Devotions: Donna Johnson "Being thankful"
- III. Review & Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes: October meeting minutes were reviewed. Motion made by Sonja J. and seconded by Quinn S. to approve the October minutes. Motion carried.
- IV. Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report was reviewed. Motion made by Sonja Jand seconded by Heather P. to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

V. Old Business

- A. Call committee update: Quinn S. reported that there will be an initial interview via zoom on November 20th with a candidate for the pastoral opening at LLC. "Make the right call, not the easy call". The discussion continued to address the housing issue for LLC since we don't have a parsonage.
- B. Fall Dinner update: The "to go" fall dinner was a success. The profit of the event was \$2,805.00 and included the basket raffle.
 - C. January/February Service Group vacancy: This vacancy still needs to be filled.
- D. Boiler system Update: Several more quotes were received and reviewed for the repair or replace of the boilers. The council voted to accept a quote from Comfort Systems to repair the system that is in place. The cost of approximately \$3,825.00 will replace the existing B&G circulating pump with a new Grundfos ECM circulating pump with "Auto Adapt" technology. This pump is very smart in regard to the systems needs. LLC's systems appears to have multiple zones throughout the building that are controlled by electric zone valves. This pump will sense when one of those zone valves opens and only deliver the amount of flow required for that specific zone, or zones that are calling or heat. This pump also runs on very little electricity which will help save on electrical cost over time.
- E. Nominating Committee Meeting, November 14th at 6:00 p.m.
- F. Prayer Chain contact emails are on the church office computer

VI. New Business

- A. Review 2024 Budget, approving wage adjustment recommendations from the Budget Committee: Motion was made by Sonja J. and seconded by Marcy P. to increase the wage secretary Paula H. as well as the custodian position to \$20.00/hr. The worship accompanists wage will receive a 3% increase. Motion carried.
- B. Final roof invoice of \$108,977.70; Insurance checks: \$135,852.86; Balance in Roof Repair Fund: \$26,875.16.

VII. Committee Reports

- A. OFJ/Education/Youth-Quinn: The OFJ is currently working on the Christmas program. We continue to have new families enrolling. There is a concern for the need of more volunteers and the need is critical.
 - B. Generosity/Outreach Sonja/Lori P.: The Fall Harvest dinner went well.
- C. Property Donna reported on the boiler issues. A member of our congregation donated a valve that was the immediate concern. Comfort Systems will replace the circulating pump.
- D. Worship/Music Marcy/Heather: The Group Leader Service leader for January/February position is still open.

- · Both pastors attended the October 12 conference meeting. Bishop Laurie was there and spoke about the new procedure for electing the bishop in 2024. Lori Morris also spoke about her new taxi service.
- · There will be a Bible study on the gospel of Mark presented by retired Luther Seminary professor Mark Fredrickson on Thursday, November 9 at Luther Park in Chetek. Pastor Mary Ann will attend.
- · Retired Bishop Bob Berg died in October. His service was held in Chetek on Oct. 28 Pastoral Acts None to report Visitation Pastor Maggie wrapped up pastoral visits in October. The new schedule will be to visit people every 6 weeks. There are currently 10 on the visitation list. Sheila Brom and Paula Hischer continue to cook and deliver monthly meals to older members.

- · The students learned about hunger globally and locally on November 1 and then visited Loaves and Fishes food pantry with food they had collected. The students and their families donated \$90 in cash and 109 pounds of food to our local pantry. Thank you!
