Dear Saints and Sinners,

Some of us ask, “What is the will of God for me today?” It is a question that I often wonder about too. When I remember the following story, however, I am reminded that what God wants me to do and to seek is usually right before me.

Once there was a father with a son who was lazy. He tried to convince his son that he should join him in the work on his farm. The son was not convinced. The father actually wondered how his son would earn his living after his death. Therefore, before his death, the father called his son and told him: “My son, I have hidden for you a great treasure in the fields.” Before the son could ask him where exactly it was hidden, the father died. After the death of his father, the son began to search for the treasure. He dug from one end of the field to the other. But he could not find any treasure.

He was disappointed, angry and desperate. As he sat there, disappointed, he came to this idea, “I dug the field anyway. Although I have not found the treasure, the least I can do is to cultivate the land!” He cultivated the land and got a great harvest. Then it occurred to him that this harvest WAS the treasure that his father had left for him in the fields. God’s will is often found simply by being obedient according to the light we already have. God gives us fields; he expects us to plow them. God gives us friends; he expects us to befriend them. God gives us an opportunity; he expects us to make the most of it. God gives us a blessing; he expects us to pass it on.

Luck Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes

June 22, 2020

Pastor Greg Ofsdahl called the meeting to order at

Present: Pastor Greg Ofsdahl, Juanita Dietmeier, Dale Nelson, Kris McCormack, Dan Hischer, Chuck Boutcher, Lori Vilstrup, Lori Aherns. Youth Representative: None; Absent: Brad Werner, Kelly Steen; Devotion presented by: Kris

Motion to approve the agenda with the following additions: none.

Motion to approve minutes from May 17 meeting. Made by Chuck and Second by Kris carried without discussion.

Treasurer's Report: Presented by Chuck Boutcher. LLC continues to be on track with giving and expenses. Uncertainties around ongoing pandemic continues, so vigilance needed. The council is grateful that giving continues at levels that support our mission. LLC was notified that the balloon mortgage came due on Hope House. Mortgage was renewed at 5% interest, with a principle of approx. \$28,000. Chuck feels that this is a higher than expected interest rate, and will look for better financing. LLC has money in a Mission Investment Fund through ELCA in the amount of \$3068.88. Paula H was contacted per phone to find out the history of this fund. It is an old fund from the dissolution of WELCA, and was not designated for anything, just placed in "savings". The council discussed making use of these funds, and it was suggested that they be used for digital displays for front of sanctuary. (See further discussion in New Business/Technology Committee)

Grace Fund/Financial Consultant: In a recent council officers' meeting, it was decided to explore Grace Fund formally becoming a part of LLC, as they operate under the auspices of the church. Plans are in place to meet with Grace Fund regarding this. At the same meeting, there was an action plan to investigate finding some professional help with the budgeting and reporting for our church. There are no concerns about any wrongdoing, rather the council is interested in simplicity and efficiency. This will be pursued in coming weeks. Discussion about having Paula attend council meetings up through Treasurer Report, as she is so knowledgeable, and council plans to include her going forward.

Church Service Format: Discussion of proposal to open church to worship starting July 5 with the following precautions: Cleaning between services, masks will be encouraged, use of every other pew, no singing, use of door that goes directly into sanctuary, increased ventilation by opening windows, no communion, no use of Bibles or hymnals. FM station in cars will still be an option.

Long discussion about safety concerns surrounding re-opening. Motion was made/seconded to re-open sanctuary worship on July 5 with above restrictions. Vote was 2 in favor, 4 against and 2 abstentions. Motion did not carry and will be addressed again next month.

Narthex Remodel: Vote on remodel to occur Sunday July 19. The required 2 week notification of this voting date to be delivered to members via regular mail. Motion by Chuck, second by Kris, to advance this vote to the congregation. Motion carried with unanimous vote.

Technology Committee: Tech committee was formed consisting of Brad Werner, Nick Johnson, Brian Paulson and Matt Babcock.

This will allow for worship enhancements, music, etc. Motion made by Lori A and second by Dan to use funds from the Mission Investment Fund to proceed with this project. Motion was carried with a unanimous vote.

Education- Juanita- Meeting this week to finalize VBS through learning and activity packages sent home to kids for 5 weeks with ZOOM meetings weekly.

Evangelism/Outreach: Lori A: Mask production continues, at a slower pace, but still some faithful sewers. Osceola Medical Center was provided with masks from the seamstresses at Luck Lutheran. GWOH shirt sale process will begin with notice in next newsletter. Members can pre-order, and sweatshirts as well as t-shirts are being offered.

Property- Dan and Kelly. Committee met on June 8. Report was submitted and summarized as follows: Thanks to Brian Paulsen and Steve McCormack, new sign installed in front of church. Note that the wood needs to weather for 6 months before staining. Tree pruning and mulching also planned. Additional sign to be installed on west side of church. Cross in place/ painted at Paula's window. Volunteer opportunities repairing and painting windows, and cleaning up edging outside. Projects in process include repair of hole in cement by kitchen entry, installation of monitors in front of sanctuary, fellowship door improvement.

Completed projects include, motion light installation by kitchen and west entrances, new valves and faucets in bathrooms. \$1200 per year will be set aside to begin saving for a new boiler.

MISSION ACTION – August

“God’s work. Our hands.”



Much has changed in the last few months about how we “do church!” But we can still “be the church” by again taking part in the collection of school supplies, mainly for Lutheran World Relief **School Kits**, but we also plan to give some to local schools. So about mid-July, when there have been sales in the past, a container will be available near the church entrance in which to place supplies you have purchased. This year we will not be putting bags out to fill.

If you prefer, please give any **monetary donations** to our church secretary, Paula, ASAP so we know what we have to work with. Supplies for one kit should cost approx. \$3.50 at sale prices. By making use of **Thrivent Action Team funds**, as well as donations from you, we should be able to reach a goal of 100 School Kits this year. Another avenue of support would be to donate to LWR’s Quilt & Kit Shipping Fund, but please note that with your donation. LWR’s approximate cost to handle and ship one School Kit overseas is \$1.40.

Please buy only the following items for each kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks (280-300 sheets total) of wide- or college-ruled paper approx. 8” X 10½”; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One **blunt** scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well) (Please leave this item in the packaging.)
- Five **unsharpened** #2 pencils with erasers
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (**no gel ink; new**)
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One eraser approx. 2½” long

ELCA Monthly Prayer Ventures 2020

1 As this time of stress and uncertainty continues, pray that we will be persistent in our generous support for the mission of the church: comforting and caring for our neighbors, responding to the global impact of the pandemic, providing food and basic necessities for people in need, reaching out to the isolated and lonely, and aiding organizations that work for the health, well-being and restoration of our communities.

2 Give thanks for God's ever-present love and care, and for the message of the psalmist who proclaims, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble."

3 Ask the Spirit to help us express our gratitude and concern for first responders, nurses, doctors and hospital employees, and to show us how to serve as God's hands and voice in caring for their spiritual, physical and emotional needs.

4 Ask God to help us cherish and not abuse the blessings of freedom and liberty, work to change our society where there is injustice and oppression, and accompany our global neighbors and companion churches striving for freedom, justice and voice.

5 Give thanks that God's love and truth are revealed to us through faith in Jesus Christ and that the Spirit is at work inspiring and equipping us to share the good news, spread truth and invite others to believe.

6 Pray for wisdom and patience as we navigate how to gather as congregations and discern what is appropriate, safe, caring and respectful of the ongoing concerns of our members, communities and nation.

7 We understand well Paul's struggle between the inclinations of human nature and following the ways of God and teachings of Jesus.

Pray for forgiveness and strengthened faith when we are weak or make poor decisions; pray that we will be guided and encouraged by the Spirit of God that dwells within us.

8 Thank God for our special relationship with the Episcopal Church, a full communion partner with the ELCA since 1999. Pray for the church, its diverse ministries and its members and leaders, and pray that together we will find mutual support, new partnerships and new resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.

9 Give thanks that “the Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. The Lord is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made.” Pray that our joy and thanksgiving will move us to be witnesses to God’s presence, grace and mercy in the world for the sake of all people.

10 Pray for the 120 ELCA companion synods that connect our congregations with Lutherans and ministries worldwide. Give thanks that together we participate in God’s mission, support each other, share our joys and sorrow, and use our gifts and resources to respond to human needs and grow the church.

11 Remember in prayer refugees and immigrants throughout the world and at our borders who hope for and seek welcoming, safe communities where they can reestablish their lives and raise their families. Pray that they will have access to health services, food and resources to meet their daily needs during this time of heightened vulnerability and isolation.

12 Pray that we will sow the seeds of the good news of Jesus Christ without bias or judgment as to how people will receive it, and that we will trust the Spirit to accomplish what God intends through our witness and service in the world.

13 Pause to reflect on the significance of the 50th anniversary of a Lutheran church choosing to ordain women in the United States.

Give thanks for the leadership, ministry and gifts of women who have served the church throughout history and for those women who endured the hardships and work leading to the ordination of women.

14 Pray for Presiding Bishop Elizabeth A. Eaton, that God will sustain her faith and strength and guide her leadership and decisions, particularly during this difficult and uncertain time in our church and society when we are looking to her for guidance and vision.

15 Give praise to God, for God's word is powerful, clear, true and trustworthy.

16 Pray for businesses that are struggling or reopening or have shut down, and for their owners, their employees and all the other people and businesses they impact. Ask God to help them make decisions and implement new health precautions that take into consideration the well-being and needs of their employees, the people they serve and their community.

17 Pray for voting members of the Western North Dakota Synod gathered for a special meeting and elections, and for members throughout the synod who will participate through livestreaming. Ask that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.

18 Give thanks that God's word is a light to our path throughout life that guides us in our baptismal journey, fills us with hope and joy, and illuminates truth and justice.

19 It is a painful, nagging reality that there are both good and evil in the world. Pray that the Spirit will renew our faith, trust and patience that God's righteousness, judgment and mercy will reign when the end of time comes.

20 Give thanks for rostered ministers in our church who are active in call, on leave from call, awaiting call or retired. Praise God for their faith, gifts, caring leadership, example and sacrifices in response to God’s call to a life of ministry and service.

21 We are church together, many members of the one body of Christ. Pray that the Spirit will unite us in our commitment to condemn sexism, anti-Semitism, white supremacy and racism against indigenous people and people of color, whenever and wherever these sins occur.

22 Pray that, like God, we might be “merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.”

23 Pray for our ELCA colleges, universities and seminaries and their faculties, staff and students as they work to adapt to and overcome the disruptions and difficulties posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. Pray that faculty and staff will find effective ways of caring for students, continuing educational experiences both in person and from a distance, enriching faith and helping students discern and prepare for their vocations.

24 Pray that we will be filled with and led by the Spirit so that our actions, words and faith reveal who we are — children of God, followers of Christ.

25 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathered for the South Carolina Synod Assembly , that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God’s work in an ever-changing world.

26 How do you envision and understand the kingdom of heaven? Pray that we might stay well-rooted in Scripture and the teachings of Christ to better understand the kingdom of heaven, and to be cautious in embracing cultural myths, traditions handed down and false promises about the kingdom of God.

27 Pray that we will continue turning to and prayerfully studying Scripture — individually and together. Pray that doing so will strengthen and deepen our faith, comfort and encourage us, guide us in loving our neighbor, and be a source of joy and thanksgiving.

28 What gives you cause for happiness and hope these days? Give thanks and praise to God for desiring joy, healing, renewed life and freedom for us and all humanity.

29 Praise God for the joy and reassurance of knowing that there is nothing — absolutely nothing — that can separate us from God’s love in Jesus Christ.

30 Give thanks for the special gifts, skills and minds of scientists, researchers and explorers who strive to better understand creation, improve the human condition, solve complex problems that cause us suffering, and restore and steward creation with a long view of sustaining future generations. Pray that they will make wise, responsible and just use of their research and discoveries for the well-being of all people and our planet.

31 Lift up in prayer our neighbors who are unemployed or underemployed and seek safe, meaningful work that will help them develop self-sufficiency and confidence and meet the needs of the people for whom they provide care, assistance and support.

As we all know, the Covid-19 pandemic has made food banks even more important to even more people. The Loaves and Fishes Food Bank in Luck has an urgent need for more volunteers.
